## TRAINING and RECRUITMENT

Learn what to do when faced with a wild animal that's in trouble and needs help. Learn what skills are necessary to safely and successfully respond to emergencies involving wildlife. This class is the ONLY one of its kind. While it is tailored for those who already work with animals and want to better their skills, it is suitable for the novice. The course is ideal for Animal Control Officers, game wardens, and emergency responders - anyone interested in becoming a Wildlife Search & Rescue Technician.

The classroom portion covers laws and regulations, human safety, capture strategies, animal handling and restraint, and basic first aid for wildlife. The outdoor portion allows participants the opportunity to put what they have learned into practice, with instruction on proper use of equipment and exercises with Robo-Duck.
